Effective January 1, 2016

Long-Acting Reversible Contraception (LARC) Inserted at Time of Delivery in a PPS Hospital

Long-acting contraception (LARC) such as IUDs and contraceptive implants are shown to be safe and highly beneficial when inserted immediately postpartum.

Montana Medicaid allows PPS hospitals to unbundle LARC devices and insertion from the inpatient delivery claim. These services are to be billed as an outpatient service on a 13X type of bill and are paid at the OPPS rates. Effective January 1, 2016, the following HCPCS/CPT codes are allowed:

- J7297 – Liletta, levonorgestrel-releasing intrauterine contraceptive system 52 mg, 3 year duration
- J7298 – Mirena, levonorgestrel-releasing intrauterine contraceptive system 52 mg, 5 year duration
- J7300 – ParaGard, intrauterine copper contraceptive
- J7301 – Skyla, levonorgestrel-releasing intrauterine contraceptive, 13.5 mg
- J7307 – Implanon/Nexplanon, etonogestrel (contraceptive) implant system, including implant and supplies
- 11981 – Insertion of drug delivery implant
- 58300 – Insertion of intrauterine device
