Mental Health & SUD Services for Non- Medicaid Individuals

Mental Health Programs for individuals who are not eligible for Medicaid:

- Short Term Voluntary Inpatient Crisis Stabilization or 14 Day Diversion Program is intended to divert individuals from commitment to the Montana State Hospital and other mental health facilities by providing reimbursement to programs that can serve individuals in a short-term voluntary inpatient setting not to exceed 14 days.

- Individual Specialized Services or Goal 189 Program facilitates a more timely discharge of individuals from Montana State Hospital (MSH) by creating opportunities and leveraging resources for integration and to divert admission to MSH.

- 72 Hour Crisis Stabilization Program provides limited payment for medically necessary crisis stabilization services delivered to adults who are not eligible for Medicaid. Any adult who is determined to be experiencing a psychiatric crisis is presumed eligible to receive medically necessary crisis stabilization services for up to 72 hours.

Why Would My Program Seek to Become a “State Approved” Chemical Dependency Program?

- **Access to county alcohol tax funds for treatment or prevention of SUD**
- **Eligible for Chemical Dependency Contract / Task Order for Non-Medicaid SUD services**

Mental Health & SUD Services for Non-Medicaid Individuals

What Non-Medicaid SUD Treatment Services are Allowed under the Chemical Dependency Tribal Task Order:

- **Services Are Only Available for Individuals Between 0% - 200% Federal Poverty Level**
- **Room and Board**: covers residential 3.1 room and board expenses for single gender and single gender with children homes
- **Rehab Aid**: These one-on-one services focus on assisting individuals receiving services, including children, adolescents, and their parents, in learning those physical, intellectual and/or emotional skills needed to participate in normal working, living, educational, and recreational activities.
- **Peer Support**: These services focus on assisting individuals during the treatment and/or recovery phase by providing approved peer-to-peer support.
- **School-Based Services**: These early intervention services are intended to be brief interventions designed to address or intervene in a pattern of behavior which includes involvement with drugs and/or alcohol.
- **Travel**: Can be used to pay for travel from the main facility to a satellite location.
- **Training**: Can be used to provide evidence-based training for professional development of staff with prior-approval from the Department.

What Is the Process for Becoming a “State Approved” Chemical Dependency Program?

- Complete the State Approval Application and submit to CD Bureau
 - List and licensure of staff, Org Chart, Board of Directors
 - Copy of Policy and Procedures addressing ARM 37.27.101 through 37.27.926; CFR 42 and 45
 - Copy of Health Care Facility License for inpatient and residential programs
 - Documentation demonstrating local need for each county seeking state approval
 - Projected services for each county seeking state approval
- Provisional State Approval Determined by CD Bureau
- Program Schedules Site Visit with QAD – required for Full State Approval
- Full State Approval Determined by QAD
